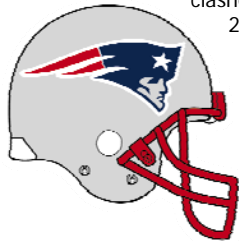




PATRIOTS VS. BUCCANEERS

SERIES HISTORY

The Patriots and Buccaneers will square off for the eighth time in preseason play and for the second straight year. The Buccaneers hold a 6-1 lead in the preseason series, including six consecutive preseason victories dating back to 1983. The teams have also played six times in the regular season, with the Patriots holding a 4-2 advantage in those games. Last season, New England opened the preseason in Tampa Bay with the Buccaneers coming out with a 13-10 win. The clubs last



clashed in the regular season on Dec. 17, 2005, when the Patriots shut out the Buccaneers, 28-0, at Gillette Stadium. With that victory, the Patriots clinched the 2005 AFC East title. This week, the Patriots will make their fourth preseason visit to Raymond James Stadium. New England has never played there in the regular season, but is scheduled to make its regular-season debut there in 2009.

The Patriots produced their most complete game of the 2005 season, recording a 28-0 shutout over the Buccaneers in Foxborough. Tampa Bay came into the game with a 9-4 record, but the Patriots jumped out to a 7-0 lead on their first possession of the game and never looked back. With the victory, New England clinched its third consecutive AFC East title, winning its division for the fourth time in five years.

New England's defense controlled the game, recording seven sacks of Bucs signal caller Chris Simms while holding Tampa to just 30 total rushing yards. The Patriots did not allow the Bucs to penetrate deeper than New England's 33-yard line as they never mounted a serious scoring chance.

On offense, Tom Brady threw for three touchdowns and compiled a 122.8 passer rating, completing 20 of 31 passes for 258 yards. David Givens led New England's receiving corps with a career-high 137 yards on six catches, including a touchdown, while Corey Dillon scored a rushing touchdown and also added a receiving score.

The Patriots opened the preseason by dropping a 13-10 decision to the Buccaneers in Tampa. Matt Bryant's 32-yard field goal as time expired provided the difference in the game as New England lost its preseason opener to a last-second field goal for the second consecutive year.

New England's first-team offense was in the game for the Patriots' first two possessions. Tom Brady completed five-of-seven passes for 34 yards, as the Patriots drove to Tampa Bay's 39-yard line on their second possession after opening the game with a three-and-out.

The Patriots' first-team defense was on the field for the Buccaneers' first three possessions. New England did not allow a first down on Tampa Bay's two first-quarter possessions, forcing a pair of three-and-outs. On the Buccaneers' first possession of the second quarter, they drove as far as the Patriots' 10-yard line, but New England held Tampa Bay to a field goal.

New England got on the board first, as quarterback Matt Cassel relieved Brady and directed a 13-play, 65-yard drive that ended in a 2-yard touchdown run by Sammy Morris to give the Patriots a 7-0 lead with 12:56 left in the first half. Tampa Bay then responded with a 13-play drive of its own, ending in a 36-yard field goal by Bryant that cut the Patriots' lead to 7-3. After the teams traded punts, Tampa Bay put together a 10-play, 69-yard touchdown drive that gave it a 10-7 lead. Buccaneers quarterback Luke McCown hit wide receiver Paris Warren for an 11-yard scoring strike with 31 seconds left in the first half.

Rookie quarterback Matt Gutierrez relieved Cassel to begin the third quarter and played the entire second half for New England. In the third quarter, the teams began by trading possessions on which they each gained one first down but saw their drives fizzle shy of midfield. On Tampa Bay's second possession of the half, it drove into New England territory and gained a first down at the Patriots' 31 yard line, looking poised to score. But on the Bucs' first-down play, second-year defensive lineman Le Kevin Smith jarred the ball loose from Tampa Bay running back Lionel Gates and rookie linebacker Justin Rogers pounced on the loose ball to give possession back to New England. Gutierrez and the Patriots then proceeded to drive to the Buccaneers' 3-yard line, but were forced to settle for a 23-yard field goal by Stephen Gostkowski that tied the game at 10 with 11:18 remaining in the contest.

The teams traded punts following Gostkowski's tying boot, and Tampa Bay took possession at its own 43-yard line with 5:58 left and the score knotted at 10. Unfortunately, the Patriots would not get the ball back, as Tampa Bay proceeded to compile an 11-play, 43-yard drive that ended with Bryant's 32-yard game-winner as time expired.

INFREQUENT FOES

The Patriots and Buccaneers have played just six times in the regular season since the series was inaugurated 30 seasons ago (1976). The Patriots' six games against Tampa Bay are the fewest against any team that entered the league prior to the most recent era of expansion, which began in 1995.

The Patriots opened the 2008 preseason with a narrow 16-15 loss to the Baltimore Ravens at Gillette Stadium. LaMont Jordan's 1-yard touchdown run with 6:07 remaining in the game cut a 16-9 Patriots deficit to just one point, but a failed two-point conversion sealed the Patriots' fate as the Ravens escaped with the win.

Baltimore recorded the game's first two scores, jumping out to a 10-0 second-quarter lead on a 42-yard field goal by Matt Stover and a 1-yard touchdown run by fullback LeRon McClain. The Patriots got on the board with a 36-yard field goal by Stephen Gostkowski following a Shawn Crable interception, but the Ravens answered with another Stover kick to take a 13-3 lead heading into halftime.

The Ravens extended their advantage to 16-3 with a 37-yard field goal to finish their first possession of the second half, but the Patriots then buckled down and did not allow any more Baltimore points for the rest of the game. New England began its final charge with a 44-yard field goal that cut the Baltimore lead to 16-6 entering the final quarter, and narrowed the deficit to 16-9 with Gostkowski's third field goal of the night on the third play of the final quarter. Pierre Woods came up with the play of the night for the Patriots when he sacked Baltimore's Joe Flacco, forcing a fumble on the play and then recovered the fumble to give the Patriots possession on the Ravens' 31-yard line. New England promptly drove in for Jordan's touchdown run, but on the two-point conversion attempt, Kevin O'Connell's pass was deflected, leaving the final score 16-15.

OPENING PRESEASON AT HOME

The Patriots opened the preseason at home for the first time since 2004, and for just the third time in Gillette Stadium history. The last time New England opened the preseason at home it defeated Philadelphia, 24-6 (8/13/04). The Patriots entered the Ravens game with three straight wins when opening the preseason with a home game, defeating Philadelphia in 2004, the New York Giants in 2003 (26-6 on 8/7/03) and the Giants again in 2001 (14-0 on 8/10/01). The last time the Patriots lost when opening the preseason at home was in 1999, then Washington claimed a 20-14 win at Foxboro Stadium (8/13/01).

EVEN STEPHEN

Stephen Gostkowski was a perfect 3-for-3, nailing field goals from 36, 44 and 40 yards. Last season, Gostkowski hit 21-of-24 field goals (87.5 percent) and all 74 of his extra point attempts (setting an NFL record). For his career, he is 41-for-50 in the regular season (82.0 percent) and 9-for-10 in the playoffs (90.0 percent). His combined career total of 50-for-60 (83.3 percent) gives him the highest field goal percentage in team history.

TOUCHDOWN FOR JORDAN

LaMont Jordan scored on a 1-yard scoring run in the fourth quarter to cut the Ravens' lead to 16-15. Jordan, who was signed by the Patriots as a free agent on July 26, has scored 24 rushing touchdowns in his seven-year career with the New York Jets (2001-04) and Oakland Raiders (2005-07).

CRABLE INTERCEPTION

Patriots rookie linebacker Shawn Crable intercepted a Kyle Boller pass and returned it 11 yards to the Ravens' 41-yard line in the second quarter. The play set up a 36-yard field goal by Stephen Gostkowski that cut the Baltimore lead to 10-3. Crable did not have an interception in his collegiate career, playing in 47 games with 20 starts for Michigan from 2004-07. His last interception in a game came as a senior at Washington High School in Massillon, Ohio.

PATRIOTS IN THE PRESEASON

New England has split its last six preseason road games dating back to 2005 and is 8-8 in preseason road contests since Bill Belichick became head coach in 2000. Since Bill Belichick became the head coach, the Patriots hold an overall mark of 20-14 (.588) in the preseason. Overall, New England is 36-57 in road preseason games and is 67-65 in preseason games against NFC clubs.

IRON MAN

Since his first NFL start on Sept. 30, 2001, Tom Brady has started 127 consecutive regular-season and playoff games for the Patriots. His streak is the longest in Patriots history and the third longest of all-time, trailing only Brett Favre (274) and Peyton Manning (172). During Brady's streak, three other quarterbacks have started a total of six preseason games, including the start by Matt Cassel against Baltimore. This year marks the second time Brady has not started a preseason opener since making his first NFL start. Rohan Davey started for the Patriots in the 2005 preseason opener at Cincinnati.

WOODS STRIP-SACK

Pierre Woods sacked Baltimore quarterback Joe Flacco, caused him to fumble on the play and then recovered the loose ball himself to give the Patriots possession at the Ravens' 31-yard line in the fourth quarter. The play set up a 31-yard scoring drive that ended in a 1-yard touchdown run by LaMont Jordan to cut Baltimore's lead to 16-15. Last season, Woods led the Patriots with 22 special teams tackles and has recorded 33 special teams tackles in 24 career games since being signed by the Patriots as an undrafted rookie free agent prior to the 2006 season.

THOMAS STRIP-SACK

Adalius Thomas strip-sacked Kyle Boller in the first quarter and Ty Warren recovered the loose ball to give the Patriots possession at the Ravens' 44-yard line. Thomas, who played seven seasons for Baltimore from 2000-06, had 6.5 sacks in his first season with the Patriots in 2007, including six sacks in his final seven regular-season games. Thomas added a pair of sacks in Super Bowl XLII. Over his eight-year NFL career, Thomas has totaled 45.0 sacks and 17 forced fumbles.

QUICK HITS

- Patriots cornerback Lewis Sanders reached in to break up a deep pass from Kyle Boller intended for Yamon Figurs in the first quarter.
- Patriots rookie linebacker Jerod Mayo stuffed Baltimore's Ray Rice for a gain of just one yard in the first quarter with a hit that knocked Rice's helmet off.
- Shawn Crable and Kenny Smith combined to down Baltimore quarterback Joe Flacco for a 3-yard sack in the fourth quarter.
- Rookie linebacker Vince Redd acrobatically broke up a Joe Flacco pass on fourth-and-one late in the fourth quarter to give the Patriots possession.
- The home preseason opener on August 7 ties the Patriots' 2003 preseason opener as their earliest home preseason opener since beginning the 1995 preseason at home on August 4 against Detroit.



ROBERT KRAFT NEWS & NOTES

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. In 14 seasons of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what many observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.311 pct.) and recording the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won eight division titles, five conference crowns and three Super Bowl championships. The Patriots have made five Super Bowl appearances since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other NFL franchise has earned more than two Super Bowl berths.

A CHAMPIONSHIP TRADITION

Since 1994, the Patriots trail only the New York Yankees and San Antonio Spurs in having won three titles in the period since Robert Kraft purchased the team.

SELLOUT STREAK

In the early 1990s, the Patriots seemed destined for relocation until Robert Kraft's purchase of the team rejuvenated local interest. In 1991, the season ticket base was just 17,635, barely enough to support the club. Now, the season-ticket base stands at a capped total of 61,759 and more than 50,000 fans are on a waiting list. The Patriots have sold out 149 consecutive home games (dating back to the 1994 regular-season opener).

SUCCESS STORY

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have been one of the NFL's elite franchises. Over the first 14 years of Kraft's ownership, the Patriots own the NFL's highest win total, the league's highest winning percentage and have won more Super Bowl titles, more conference championships and more playoff games than any other NFL team.

Bill Belichick is the only head coach in NFL history to win three Super Bowl titles in a four-year span. In the 2007 season, Belichick led the Patriots to the fourth undefeated and untied regular season in the NFL's 88-year history and the first since the NFL established a 16-game schedule in 1978. He has led the Patriots to the Super Bowl four times in the last seven seasons and has produced five straight AFC East titles and six division championships in the last seven seasons. Belichick's Patriots teams own the all-time NFL records for consecutive total victories (21 from 2003-04), consecutive regular-season victories (19 from 2006-07) and consecutive playoff victories (10 from 2001-05). Belichick owns the second best postseason record in NFL history (15-4) and is the winningest NFL head coach since 2001 (100-29). From 2003-04, he directed the Patriots to back-to-back Super Bowl titles while posting consecutive 17-win campaigns. Belichick has spent more seasons in the league than any other current NFL head coach, and in that time has been a part of five Super Bowl championship teams. His overall record of 105-40 with the Patriots gives him the most victories and the best winning percentage of any head coach in franchise history. Coach Belichick's overall career winning percentage of .626 (142-85-0) ranks fifth among the 18 NFL coaches with 140 or more wins. He trails only George Halas (324-151-31, .682), Don Shula (347-173-6, .666), Curly Lambeau (229-134-22, .631), and Joe Gibbs (171-101-0, .629).

ELITE COMPANY

Bill Belichick is one of nine NFL head coaches to win three or more championships since the league began postseason play in 1933. With the Patriots' victory in Super Bowl XXXIX, Belichick joined an exclusive club in which each of the eight other members has been enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame.
