



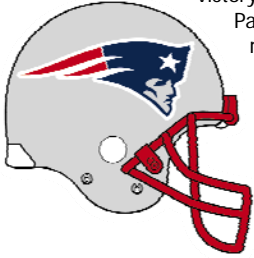
PATRIOTS VS. CHIEFS

SERIES HISTORY

The Patriots and Chiefs will renew acquaintances for the 31st time overall and for the third time in a regular-season opener. The last time the two clubs met was in 2005, where the Chiefs won by a 26-16 score at Arrowhead Stadium. The regular-season opener marks the second time Kansas City will play at Gillette Stadium. The first time was in 2002 with the Patriots holding home-field advantage with a 41-38 overtime



victory. It has been 31 years since the Patriots and Chiefs have squared off in a regular-season opener. The last time was September 18, 1977 at Schaefer Stadium, when the Patriots won, 21-17. The other time the teams faced each other in a regular-season opener was on September 8, 1962, when the Chiefs were known as the Dallas Texans.

The Patriots and Chiefs battled in week 12 of the 2005 season and the Patriots faced an uphill battle at the midway point as they trailed 19-3 at halftime. The Chiefs stringent defense picked off Tom Brady four times and limited the Patriots to their lowest scoring total of the 2005 season for a 26-16 victory. The Patriots bounced back to win their next four games and went on to win the division for the third straight year. The 2005 game against the Chiefs was Bill Belichick's 100th as head coach of the Patriots.



PATRIOTS VS. CHIEFS

CONNECTIONS

- Chiefs head coach **Herm Edwards** is very familiar with the Patriots as he served as their division rival New York Jets head coach from 2001-05. Edwards compiled a 2-8 record against the Patriots during that span.
- Chiefs head coach **Herm Edwards**, while the Jets head coach, made Patriots running back **LaMont Jordan** his second draft pick as a head coach when he was taken with the 49th overall pick in the second round of the 2001 draft. Jordan played for Edwards from 2001-04.
- Patriots quarterback **Tom Brady** set career highs with 410 passing yards and 39 completions in a 41-38 overtime win over Kansas City on Sept. 22, 2002.
- Kansas City quarterback **Damon Huard** was with the Patriots from 2001-03 and was on New England's 2001 and 2003 Super Bowl championship teams.
- Patriots offensive tackle **Wesley Britt** protected Chiefs quarterback **Brodie Croyle** at the University of Alabama from 2001-04. Britt's protection helped Croyle set a number of school records, including career passing yards (6,382) and touchdowns (41).
- Chiefs vice president of player personnel **Bill Kuharich** began his football career as a graduate assistant at Brown University in 1976.
- Chiefs offensive line coach **Bob Bicknell** was born in Holliston, Mass., and played tight end for Boston College from 1988-91. He served on Boston University's coaching staff from 1993-97.
- Chiefs assistant head coach and quarterbacks coach **Dick Curiel** served as quarterbacks coach at Boston College in 1990.
- Chiefs defensive backs coach **David Gibbs** was the defensive coordinator and secondary coach at Auburn in 2005 when Patriots rookie cornerback **Jonathan Wilhite** was a freshman on the team.
- Patriots cornerback **Jonathan Wilhite** and Chiefs defensive tackle **T.J. Jackson** were both at Auburn from 2004-05.
- Patriots cornerback **Terrence Wheatley** and Chiefs guard **Edwin Harrison** are both rookies from Colorado.
- Patriots linebacker **Gary Guyton** (2004-07), along with Chiefs fullback **Mike Cox** (2004-07) and tight end **John Paul Foschi** (2002-03) all played at Georgia Tech when Chiefs offensive coordinator **Chan Gailey** was the head coach (2002-07).
- Patriots linebacker **Eric Alexander** and Chiefs center **Rudy Niswanger** were teammates at Louisiana State University.
- Patriots linebacker **Bo Ruud** and Chiefs linebacker **Steve Octavien** are both rookies out of the University of Nebraska.
- Patriots linebacker **Adalius Thomas** and Chiefs cornerback **Patrick Surtain** were teammates at the University Southern Mississippi.
- Patriots linebacker **Jerod Mayo** and Chiefs tight end **Brad Cottam** are both rookies out of the University of Tennessee.
- Patriots linebacker **Adalius Thomas** was a teammate of Chiefs wide receiver **Devard Darling** and kick returner **B.J. Sams** on the Baltimore Ravens from 2004-06.
- Patriots safety **Rodney Harrison** and Chiefs linebacker **Donnie Edwards** and offensive tackle **Damion McIntosh** were teammates on the San Diego Chargers in 2002.
- Patriots running back **Sammy Morris** and Chiefs defensive tackle **Ron Edwards** were teammates on the Buffalo Bills from 2001-03.
- Patriots running back **Sammy Morris** and receiver **Wes Welker** were teammates with Chiefs center **Wade Smith** on the Miami Dolphins from 2004-05.
- Patriots linebacker **Larry Izzo** and Chiefs cornerback **Patrick Surtain** were teammates on the Miami Dolphins from 1998-2000.

THIS WEEK IN PATRIOTS HISTORY

SEPTEMBER 1-7

Sept. 7, 1986 – The Patriots' 1985 AFC Championship Banner was raised at Sullivan Stadium in a pregame ceremony prior to a 33-3 victory in the 1986 season opener against the Indianapolis Colts.

Sept. 1, 1991 – In Dick MacPherson's first game as head coach, the Patriots open the 1991 season with a 16-7 win at Indianapolis, breaking a streak of 14 straight losses dating back to Sept. 23, 1990.

Sept. 4, 1994 – In the Patriots' first regular-season game following Robert Kraft's purchase of the team, Drew Bledsoe sets franchise opening day records with 421 yards and four touchdown passes in a 39-35 loss to the Dolphins in Miami.



ROBERT KRAFT NEWS & NOTES

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. In 14 seasons of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what many observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.311 pct.) and recording the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won eight division titles, five conference crowns and three Super Bowl championships. The Patriots have made five Super Bowl appearances since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other NFL franchise has earned more than two Super Bowl berths.

A CHAMPIONSHIP TRADITION

Since 1994, the Patriots trail only the New York Yankees and San Antonio Spurs in having won three titles in the period since Robert Kraft purchased the team.

SELLOUT STREAK

In the early 1990s, the Patriots seemed destined for relocation until Robert Kraft's purchase of the team rejuvenated local interest. In 1991, the season ticket base was just 17,635, barely enough to support the club. Now, the season-ticket base stands at a capped total of 61,759 and more than 50,000 fans are on a waiting list. The Patriots have sold out 151 consecutive home games (dating back to the 1994 regular-season opener).

SUCCESS STORY

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have been one of the NFL's elite franchises. Over the first 14 years of Kraft's ownership, the Patriots own the NFL's highest win total, the league's highest winning percentage and have won more Super Bowl titles, more conference championships and more playoff games than any other NFL team.

Bill Belichick is the only head coach in NFL history to win three Super Bowl titles in a four-year span. In the 2007 season, Belichick led the Patriots to the fourth undefeated and untied regular season in the NFL's 88-year history and the first since the NFL established a 16-game schedule in 1978. He has led the Patriots to the Super Bowl four times in the last seven seasons and has produced five straight AFC East titles and six division championships in the last seven seasons. Belichick's Patriots teams own the all-time NFL records for consecutive total victories (21 from 2003-04), consecutive regular-season victories (19 from 2006-07) and consecutive playoff victories (10 from 2001-05). Belichick owns the second best postseason record in NFL history (15-4) and is the winningest NFL head coach since 2001 (100-29). From 2003-04, he directed the Patriots to back-to-back Super Bowl titles while posting consecutive 17-win campaigns. Belichick has spent more seasons in the league than any other current NFL head coach, and in that time has been a part of five Super Bowl championship teams. His overall record of 105-40 with the Patriots gives him the most victories and the best winning percentage of any head coach in franchise history. Coach Belichick's overall career winning percentage of .626 (142-85-0) ranks fifth among the 18 NFL coaches with 140 or more wins. He trails only George Halas (324-151-31, .682), Don Shula (347-173-6, .666), Curly Lambeau (229-134-22, .631), and Joe Gibbs (171-101-0, .629).

ELITE COMPANY

Bill Belichick is one of nine NFL head coaches to win three or more championships since the league began postseason play in 1933. With the Patriots' victory in Super Bowl XXXIX, Belichick joined an exclusive club in which each of the eight other members has been enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

Bill Belichick is one of just four head coaches to win three championships since the Super Bowl Era began following the 1966 season. Coach Belichick joins three members of the Pro Football Hall of Fame in the exclusive club. Belichick is the only coach to win three Super Bowls in the post-1993 salary cap era.

HUNDRED WIN CLUB

Bill Belichick has won 105 overall games since becoming Patriots head coach in 2000. He took 139 games to reach 100 victories with the team, the fourth fewest number of games by any coach in NFL history to reach 100 wins with a franchise. Belichick is one of three current NFL head coaches who have won 100 or more games with their current team. Belichick has recorded 91 regular-season wins and 14 playoff victories with New England.

TOPS IN TEAM HISTORY

Bill Belichick is the most successful head coach in Patriots history. He has recorded more wins (105) and a higher winning percentage (.724) than any of the 13 previous head coaches.

COACH BELICHICK ON...

Coach Belichick on Wesley Britt, Aug. 12

Wes came to us a couple of years ago and we put him on the practice squad. He has developed a lot and is one of the hardest working guys on the team. He has a big frame, like you would like a tackle to have. He played left tackle in college. He has played both left and right tackle for us. He has swing ability. He works hard and is a tough kid. He has improved a lot since he has been here, like a lot of our young offensive linemen do. He is one of many who has been on the practice squad and eventually worked his way on to the roster and then worked his way into the lineup for some playing time. He has done nothing but improve since he has been here. His hard work, determination and ability to take coaching have enabled him to do that. When he has had an opportunity to play, I would say he has played very competitively.

Coach Belichick on Jabar Gaffney, July 31

He was one of our off-season award winners at his position. I think he followed up last season with a good off-season and a good spring camp. He has taken it into training camp. He is a very versatile player that played every position for us last year, whether it was three wide receivers or four wide receivers. At one point or another he played in each spot. He is a guy that picks things up quickly. Quarterbacks have a lot of confidence in him. He has been a very dependable player for us. He is really a key guy for us and was like that last year.

Coach Belichick on Gary Guyton, Aug. 19

Gary was very productive for Georgia Tech. He played both inside and a little bit of outside. He was a pretty versatile player for them down there in terms of run defense, blitzing, pass coverage, inside, outside, played on the end of the line, played on the center, played on the guard, at times he even played in the tackle bubble so he has had a lot of different experiences in college and I think some of that versatility has shown up here for us both in the kicking game and on defense.

Coach Belichick on Rodney Harrison, July 31

He brings a level of play and intensity out there to the practice field that is good for everybody. It is good for the defense, offense and for the entire football team. Nobody practices harder than Rodney. I don't think, in my career, I have ever coached a player that practices any harder than Rodney practices on a daily basis. He has a tremendous work ethic and is as good as anybody I have been around, especially on the defensive side of the ball. That carries over to other players and forces them to rise up to his level. It is good to have him back out there.

Coach Belichick on Russ Hochstein, Aug. 4

I don't know where we would be without [Russ's versatility]. Russ is one of the most solid and consistent players we have on our team. He is really the same guy everyday, whether it be practice, games, preseason or postseason, the first quarter, or the fourth quarter – it doesn't matter. He is a very consistent and dependable guy.

Coach Belichick on LaMont Jordan, Aug. 12

Every player has their own set of skills. I think LaMont has a good set. He is a powerful guy, has some quickness and catches the ball well. He has good speed, he is not a track guy, but he has competitive speed, good quickness and can get through the hole. He breaks tackles. He has some things going for him.

Coach Belichick on Jerod Mayo, Aug. 12

Jerod [Mayo] is a smart kid and has worked hard. From day one when we drafted him to rookie minicamp and spring camp he has done a good job. He is a very mature kid and a hard worker. Football is important to him and he spends a lot of time on it. He makes a lot of rookie mistakes but he learns from them and doesn't repeat many of them.

Coach Belichick on Brandon Meriweather, July 31

I thought he made a lot of improvement last season during the course of the year and in training camp. He had a good off-season and a good spring. He is having a good training camp. I think he is much better now than where he was last year at this time. He continues to improve on a regular basis. He works hard and takes coaching well.

Coach Belichick on Lewis Sanders, Aug. 4

Lewis is working hard. He is another guy that has had a lot of different responsibilities for us in the kicking game, playing both corner and safety defensively. He's got good experience in a couple different systems so I don't think anything he is doing here is anything that new. It is just a question on some new terminology or adapting it to a different situation but he is an experienced guy and he keeps showing up. He shows up with a play or two everyday and he is a hard working guy.

Coach Belichick on Richard Seymour, Aug. 13

I think Richard has [tipped as many passes and disrupted the quarterback] as well as anybody. Year in and year out, he has tipped more balls than anybody around here and more than anyone I have coached. He is tall and has long arms. He is athletic, can jump and has a good sense of timing of when to try and get in the throwing lane, when to keep rushing the quarterback and attack the blocker. He is probably as good as you are going to get at that.

Coach Belichick on Matthew Slater, Aug. 4

Matthew is a smart kid. We have been working him at some different spots since he has gotten here in all three phases of the game. We will see how that all comes together but he is a smart guy that has a good set of skills.

Coach Belichick on Adalius Thomas, Aug. 13

Adalius is a smart guy who works hard. He has played in multiple positions in our defense. He has a lot of experience from doing different things. I think he has really become one of the leaders on defense, not that he wasn't last year but more so going into his second year. Going into his second year he knows more of what he is doing as opposed to feeling like 'I have to learn this and learn that.' I am not saying he doesn't have anything to learn; we all have more to learn. He is a lot further ahead than he was last year. He really stepped up and gave a lot of leadership and good work ethic to the entire unit. He has done well and we are glad to have him.

Coach Belichick on David Thomas, Aug. 19

The bad news for David [Thomas] was '07. The good news was he really got off to a good start in '08. Kind of getting off to a good start, he's been able to maintain that momentum and the start there in the spring has carried over in the training camp and the preseason ... David works hard. He works hard at everything. He's a very competitive kid. He's smart. He knows how to use his strengths, leverage and position to his advantage. He competes hard. He has good playing strength and good quickness. He has done a good job with that.

Coach Belichick on Ray Ventrone, Aug. 7

Ray is a very competitive guy and a tough kid. He plays in all three phases, offense, defense and special teams. He works hard, tough kid and he's a pretty good football player. He's got a good set of skills, has some quickness, speed, he's tough, he's a smart player who is instinctive and he's shown up positively for us in a number of different roles and in different games. It's a real credit to him, his work ethic, his toughness.

Coach Belichick on Pierre Woods, July 27

Pierre [Woods] is one of our hardest workers and one of our most diligent players. He works hard at his job and tries to do everything right, just the way you want it.

LAURENCE MARONEY ran for 100 or more yards in four of his final six games last season, including playoffs. CHARTER MEMBER OF 30/30 CLUB

RODNEY HARRISON is the only player in NFL history to record at least 30 sacks and at least 30 interceptions in his career. He has 30.5 career sacks and 33 career interceptions over 14 seasons with the San Diego Chargers (1994-2002) and New England Patriots (2003-07). Harrison established the 30/30 club on Oct. 21, 2007, when a sack against the Miami Dolphins raised his career sack total to 30.5. Harrison is the NFL's all-time leader in sacks by a defensive back, dating back to when sacks became an official NFL statistic in 1982.
