

## PATRIOTS VS. PACKERS

#### SERIES HISTORY

The Patriots will face the Packers for just the 10th time overall and the ninth time in the regular season. The regular season series is tied at 4-4. Green Bay beat the Patriots in the one postseason meeting between the two teams, a 35-21 Packers victory in Super Bowl XXXI at the Louisiana Superdome in New Orleans on Jan. 26, 1997.



The Patriots beat Green Bay, 35-0, in the last meeting on Nov. 19, 2006 at Lambeau Field. That game was New England's second visit ever to Green Bay in a regular season game.

Green Bay will be making its sixth visit to Foxborough and its second visit to Gillette Stadium. Green Bay beat New England



28-10 at Gillette Stadium on Oct. 13, 2002. That is the only game the Patriots have ever lost to an NFC team at Gillette Stadium.

The Patriots first regular-season home victory under Robert Kraft was on Oct. 2, 1994 in a 17-16 win against Green Bay.

The Patriots improved to 7-3 on the season with their first road shutout in 20 years and handed the Packers their secondworst home shutout loss in a history that dates back to 1921. New England tied a club record with its seventh straight road victory and allowed Green Bay to gain just 120 total net yards.

New England was solid in all phases of the game. Tom Brady tied his career high with four touchdown passes and posted a season-best 128.2 passer rating. On defense, the Patriots held the Packers to just 1-of-8 on third-down chances and did not allow a Green Bay drive of longer than 26 yards. Packers quarterbacks Brett Favre and Aaron Rodgers each completed just a third of their pass attempts as New England held Green Bay to just 9-of-27 passing and the Packers were held to 2.5 yards per carry.

#### **PATRIOTS VS. NFC**

The Patriots have been successful against NFC teams in recent seasons, compiling a 34-5 (.872) regular-season record against the conference since 2001. Including the postseason, the Patriots are 37-6 (.860) against the NFC with a 3-1 Super Bowl record since 2001.

The Patriots ended a 17-game winning streak against the NFC last season following a loss at New Orleans on Monday Night Football. The Patriots were 3-1 against the NFC last season.

The Patriots are 10-1 all-time against the NFC North since realignment in 2002. The Patriots have squared off against the NFC North in two seasons, finishing 3-1 in 2002 and 4-0 in 2006. The only loss was a 28-10 defeat vs. Green Bay on Oct. 13, 2002. The Patriots are 3-0 so far against the NFC North in 2010 following a 28-18 win over Minnesota on Oct. 31, a 45-24 win on Thanksgiving at Detroit on Nov. 25 and last week's 36-7 win at Chicago.

Neither the snow or the third-ranked Chicago defense could stop Tom Brady and the New England Patriots in a 36-7 victory at Soldier Field in wintery conditions. The game-time temperature was 26 degrees with snow and a 30-mile per hour wind. Brady threw for 369 yards and two touchdowns as the Patriots clinched a playoff berth for the 12<sup>th</sup> time in 17 years of ownership under Robert Kraft.

The win was the fifth straight for the Patriots, who improved to an 11-2 record. The Patriots wasted little time taking control of the game with a 26-point second quarter to jump to a 33-0 lead at the break. The win was the  $174^{\rm th}$  for Bill Belichcik, putting him in a tie for  $10^{\rm th}$  place with Mike Holmgren.

Brady picked the Bears defense apart, completing 27-of-40 passes for 369 yards and improving to eight straight starts without an interception.

Deion Branch finished with eight receptions for a career-high 151 yards receiving, including a 59-yard touchdown reception from Brady on the last play of the second quarter. Wes Welker added 115 yards receiving as the Patriots generated 27 first downs and 475 total yards while holding the Bears to 185 total yards.

Chicago QB Jay Cutler struggled, completing just 12 completions with two interceptions deep in New England territory and one fumble. The Patriots defense forced two fumbles in the second quarter, including one by CB Devin McCourty that resulted in a touchdown when LB Gary Guyton picked up the loose ball and returned it 35 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter.

Brady engineered an 85-yard scoring drive that ended in a 7-yard touchdown strike to TE Rob Gronkowski in the first quarter. RB Danny Woodhead capped an 11-play, 87-yard drive in the second quarter with a 3-yard touchdown run. Twenty seconds later the Patriots made it 21-0 after McCourty stripped the ball away from WR Johnny Knox, allowing Guyton to recover the ball and run it 35 yards for a touchdown.

Later in the period, WR Julian Edelman returned a punt 42 yards to set up a field goal for a 24-0 lead. On the next series, LB Eric Moore forced a fumble on a sack that was recovered LB Jerod Mayo at the Chicago 9-yard to set up another field goal for a 27-0 lead. The Brady-to-Branch touchdown pass at the end of the first half gave New England a commanding 33-0 halftime lead.

#### PATRIOTS CLINCH PLAYOFF BERTH

New England has now qualified for the playoffs 18 times in its 51-year history. The Patriots have earned 12 playoff berths in the 17 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, a dramatic contrast to the six total playoff berths that the team earned in its first 34 years of existence.

### PATRIOTS ARE GOOD IN THE SNOW

The Patriots played the Bears under snowy conditions and improved to an 11-0 record under head coach Bill Belichick when playing in the snow. In the last three games played in the snow, the Patriots have outscored their opponents 142-14.

## **GRONKOWSKI SCORES HIS SEVENTH TD OF 2010**

Patriots rookie tight end Rob Gronkowski caught his seventh touchdown reception of the season on a 7-yard pass from QB Tom Brady in the first quarter. Gronkowski is chasing down WR Jim Colclough and WR Randy Vataha for the Patriots rookie receiving touchdown record of 9 touchdowns. Gronkowski ranks in the top five for total touchdowns among all Patriots rookies. He ranks third in NFL history for touchdowns by a rookie tight end. Only Mike Ditka (12) and Junior Miller (9) had more touchdowns as rookies.

## PATRIOTS EXTEND STREAK TO FIVE GAMES WITH 30 POINTS AND NO TURNOVERS

The Patriots have scored at least 30 points without committing a turnover in each of their past five games to extend their NFL record. Last week they became the first team to have at least 30 points without committing a turnover in four straight games.

## BRADY EXTENDS STREAK WITH AT LEAST TWO TOUCHDOWNS AND NO INTERCEPTIONS TO SIX TO TIE THE NFL MARK

Quarterback Tom Brady has thrown at least two touchdowns without an interception in each of his past six games to tie Don Meredith (1965-66) for the longest streak in league annals.

### **GUYTON SCORES ON A 35-YARD FUMBLE RETURN**

LB Gary Guyton returned a fumble 35 yards for a touchdown after CB Devin McCourty forced a fumble on a tackle in the second quarter. It is Guyton's second touchdown of the season. Guyton returned an interception 59 yards for a touchdown in the season-opening victory vs. Cincinnati (9/12). It is the first fumble returned for a touchdown by a New England player since Ellis Hobbs scored on a 35-yard fumble return at Buffalo on Nov. 18, 2007. It is the fourth defensive touchdown of the season for the Patriots. Guyton is the first Patriots player to score two defensive touchdowns in a season since LB Tedy Bruschi returned two interceptions for touchdowns in 2003.

## PATRIOTS HAVE SEVEN NON-OFFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS IN 2007

The Patriots have scored on seven touchdowns that were not offensive touchdowns in 2010. The Patriots returned three interceptions for a touchdown, returned two kickoffs for touchdowns, scored on one fumble return and one blocked field goal that was returned for a touchdown. The seven non-offensive touchdowns are second in the NFL to Arizona who has scored on nine non-offensive touchdowns.

## PATRIOTS SET NFL RECORD WITH FIVE GAMES WITHOUT A TURNOVER

The Patriots extended their streak to five straight games without a turnover to establish an NFL record. Last week, the Patriots established the team mark with their fourth straight game without a turnover.

## EDELMAN HAS CAREER-LONG 42-YARD PUNT RETURN

Julian Edelman had a career-long 42-yard punt return in the second quarter. His previous best was a 35-yarder vs. Tennessee on Oct. 18, 2009. Both of those punt returns were in snow games

## ERIC MOORE FORCES A FUMBLE ON A SACK IN HIS DEBUT

Eric Moore forced a fumble on a 10-yard sack that was recovered by LB Jerod Mayo at the Chicago 9-yard line in the second quarter. Moore was playing in his first game as a member of the Patriots.

## **BRANCH HAS NINTH 100-YARD GAME**

Deion Branch scored on a 59-yard touchdown pass prior to the end of the first half to push him over 100 yards receiving for the day. He finished the game with 151 receiving yards. He had his first 100-yard day of 2010 at Detroit (11/25) with three receptions for 113 yards. It is his sixth 100-yard game as a member of the Patriots.

#### BRANCH HAS CAREER-HIGH IN RECEIVING YARDS

Branch set a personal best with 151 receiving yards. His previous best was a 130-yard performance on Sept. 30, 2007 at San Francisco while he was with Seattle.

## PATRIOTS HAVE TWO PLAYERS REACH 100 YARDS RECEIVING

Wes Welker (115) and Deion Branch (151) both finished with over 100 yards receiving. It is the first time the Patriots have had a game with two 100-yard receivers since the game in the snow last season vs. Tennessee on Oct. 18, 2009.

## Robert Kraft News & Notes

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. In 17 seasons of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what many observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93),



the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.311 pct.) and recording the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won nine division titles, five conference crowns and three Super Bowl championships. The Patriots have made five Super Bowl appearances since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other NFL franchise has earned more than three berths.

#### SELLOUT STREAK

In the early 1990s, the Patriots seemed destined for relocation until Robert Kraft's purchase of the team rejuvenated local interest. In 1991, the season ticket base was just 17,635, barely enough to support the club. Now, the season-ticket base stands at a capped total of 61,759 and more than 50,000 fans are on a waiting list. The Patriots have sold out 178 consecutive home games (dating back to the 1994 regular-season opener).

## SUCCESS STORY

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have been one of the NFL's elite franchises. In the 17 seasons of Kraft's ownership, the Patriots own the NFL's highest winning percentage and have won more Super Bowl titles, more conference championships, more playoff games and more regular-season games than any other NFL team. The Patriots have now won nine or more games in 14 of the 17 seasons that Robert Kraft has owned the team.

Bill Belichick is the only head coach in NFL history to win three Super Bowl titles in a four-year span. He spent 20 years as an assistant coach in the NFL and this is his 16th season as a head coach. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the only man in NFL history to serve 20 or more seasons as an assistant coach and at least 15 seasons as a head coach. Over a 100-game span from 2003-08, Belichick directed the team to an 82-18 record, marking the best 100-game span for any team in NFL history. In the 2007 season, Belichick led the Patriots to the fourth undefeated and untied regular season in the NFL's 90-year history and the first since the NFL established a 16-game schedule in 1978. Belichick's Patriots teams own the all-time NFL records for consecutive total victories (21 from 2003-04), and established the record for consecutive regular-season victories (21 from 2006-08) and consecutive playoff victories (10 from 2001-05). Belichick has spent more seasons in the league than any other current NFL head coach, and in that time has been a part of five Super Bowl championship teams.

## BELICHICK LEADS TEAM TO 10<sup>TH</sup> STRAIGHT WINNING RECORD

Bill Belichick has led the Patriots to a winning record for 10 consecutive seasons. The only other NFL coach to have at least 10 consecutive winning seasons with one team since the 1970 merger was Tom Landry, who led the Dallas Cowboys to 16 consecutive winning seasons (1970-1985).

# WELKER ON PACE TO LEAD THE TEAM IN RECEPTIONS FOR RECORD FOURTH STRAIGHT YEAR IN 2010

Wes Welker enters the Packers game with a team-leading 80 receptions and currently ranks third in the NFL. He needs to average seven catches in the last three games to join Marvin Harrison as the only other player with four straight 100 reception seasons. He can become the first Patriots' player ever to lead the team in receptions in four straight seasons.

## **WELKER'S ROUTE TO THE NFL**

Despite being named the Oklahoma football player of the year by both *USA Today* and the *Daily Oklahoman*, Wes Welker's only scholarship offer came from Texas Tech, and only after a player that committed to Texas Tech backed out.

"I was thinking I'd get a scholarship somewhere," Welker said. "When it didn't happen, when it was supposed, to I was pretty hurt by it."

Welker had an impressive collegiate career, accumulating 259 receptions and eight punts returned for touchdowns. He even won a national award as the best special teams player in the country. Despite those accolades, he was passed over in the 2004 NFL draft and signed with San Diego as a free agent. He made the team, then was cut after the first game. He signed with Miami soon after and was used just on special teams. He caught New England's eye with a 71-yard punt return on Monday Night Football in a game against the Patriots. He was acquired by the Patriots in a trade with Miami in 2007.

## **DEION BRANCH RETURNS TO THE PATRIOTS**

Deion Branch was acquired by the Patriots in a trade with Seattle on Oct. 12, 2010. Originally a second-round pick of the Patriots in 2002, Branch was traded to Seattle in 2006 for a first round pick (Brandon Meriweather). Branch returns to a team that he helped win two Super Bowls. Branch was awarded the Pete Rozelle Trophy as the Most Valuable Player of Super Bowl XXXIX. His 11 receptions in the game tied the Super Bowl record, also achieved by Jerry Rice, Dan Ross and Wes Welker. On the day of Super Bowl XXXIX, Deion called a dozen of his former football coaches to thank them for the support that they gave him throughout his high school, junior college and college careers. Hours after talking to his coaches, he tied the Super Bowl record with 11 receptions and was named MVP of the game. Branch has turned in his biggest performances on the greatest stage in sports, leading all receivers in Super Bowls XXXVIII and XXXIX. He recorded a combined 21 receptions in the two games and owns two of the top seven receiving performances in Super Bowl history. His career reception total in the Super Bowl ranks third all-time, trailing only Jerry Rice (33) and Andre Reed (27)

## **ROOKIE TIGHT ENDS ARE MAKING AN IMPACT**

Rob Gronkowski leads all rookie tight ends with seven touchdown catches, while Aaron Hernandez ranks second with four. If Hernandez catches a touchdown this Sunday vs. Green Bay, he and Gronkowski would be the first pair of rookie tight end teammates with at least five TD receptions in the same season in NFL history.

#### **ROB GRONKOWSKI SETS PATS ROOKIE TE MARK**

Gronkowski has 7 touchdowns to establish a record for most touchdown catches by a rookie tight end in Patriots history, besting Russ Francis (4 in 1975) and Don Hasselbeck (4 in 1977). Gronkowski became the first Patriots rookie to ever record three touchdowns in a game with a three-TD game at Pittsburgh (11/14). The Patriots record for most touchdown catches by a rookie is 9 WR John Colclough in 1960 and WR Randy Vataha in 1971.

He ranks third in NFL history for touchdowns by a rookie tight end. Only Mike Ditka (12) and Junior Miller (9) had more touchdowns as rookies.

## BRANDON TATE HAS TWO KICKOFFS RETURNED FOR TOUCHDOWNS IN 2010

Brandon Tate has blossomed into a dual threat in both the return game and the receiving game. He has returned two kickoffs for touchdowns to provide the Patriots a spark on special teams, after returning the second half kickoff vs. Cincinnati 97 yards for a touchdown and the second half kickoff at Miami 103 yards for a touchdown. He is the first Patriots player to return two kicks for a touchdown in a season since Kevin Faulk returned two for a touchdown in 2002. The Patriots record for most kickoff returns for a touchdown in a season is three by Raymond Clayborn in 1977. His prowess for returns carries over from his collegiate days where he holds numerous NCAA and ACC career records including the NCAA career record for combined kick and punt return yards with 3,523. A native of North Carolina, Tate was a four-year return man for the Tar Heels. Tate suffered a knee injury against Notre Dame as a senior and missed the final seven games of the season. Tate joined the Patriots in the third round of the 2009 draft, but his rookie year was derailed by injury as he was placed on injured reserve on Nov. 14 after seeing action in only two games.

## **WOODHEAD GOES FROM DIVISION II TO THE NFL**

Danny Woodhead was a standout at Division II Chadron State in Nebraska. He averaged 178.9 yards per game and totaled 101 rushing touchdowns during his collegiate career. Woodhead's outstanding junior and senior seasons earned him two Harlon Hill Trophies, the Division II equivalent to the Heisman Trophy. He is one of just three players to ever win two or more Harlon Hill Trophies, joining Texas A&M University-Kingsville running back Johnny Bailey, who won it three times (1987-89) before playing six seasons in the NFL for the Bears, Cardinals, and Rams. Valdosta State University's Dusty Bonner was the only other player to win the Harlon Hill Trophy multiple times (2000 and 2001). Cincinnati Bengals running back Bernard Scott (2008—Abilene Christian) joins Woodhead as active NFL running backs who have won the award.

### **WILFORK WEARS HIS HEART ON HIS NECK**

Vince Wilfork wears No. 75 over his shoulder pads. Underneath hangs a gold chain locket for those who were number one in his heart: his parents. In 2002, parents David and Barbara Wilfork both passed away within five months of each other, leaving the then University of Miami star without his greatest support system. Wilfork, who lost his father to diabetes, has raised hundreds of thousands of dollars for diabetes-related causes. His annual draft day fundraiser, a bowling event he has held for seven years, is one of the signature fundraising events held by a pro athlete in New England. For his charity work, Wilfork was awarded the 2010 New England Patriots Ron Burton Community Service Award. While he will always cherish his National Championship and Super Bowl rings, his constant reminder lies closest to his heart, a picture of his late parents at their high school prom. "I carry them with me wherever I go", Wilfork said of his parents' keepsake. "My parents pushed me to be the best I could be. The things I do and my wife does, we do out of the kindness of our heart, and we do it for the community. I never look for anything in return. My teammates are my second family. My kids, my wife, the New England Patriots - that's all I have."

#### **ZOLTAN MESKO: COMING TO AMERICA**

Rookie P Zoltan Mesko was born in Timosoara, Romania, on the Romania-Hungary border. On Many occasions in 1989, during the communist revolutions, his family was forced to take cover by diving on the floor to avoid gun shots from the armies. Even after the fall of the Berlin Wall, his family lived in poverty. His family was finally able to escape Romania when his father won a United States Permanent Resident Card (green card) in the Diversity Immigrant Visa Lottery in 1997 when Mesko was 11.

### **MESKO DISCOVERS FOOTBALL**

An avid soccer player from his days in Romania, Mesko had a strong leg. It was only when he came to America that he discovered his leg could take him places. In eighth grade, Mesko was playing kickball in the gym when he kicked the ball so high that he broke a light fixture. He was given a choice: pay for the light fixture or play football. With his family still struggling with money and football being a more popular sport than soccer at his school, the choice was an obvious one—Mesko decided to play football. His leg would land him numerous Division I Scholarships and admission offers from Ivy League schools. From these, Mesko chose to play football at Michigan.

### **DOUBLE TROUBLE: CB DEVIN MCCOURTY**

After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, CB Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, is a cornerback with Tennessee, selected in the sixth round of the 2009 NFL Draft. The two are the 11<sup>th</sup> set of twins to play in the NFL. Devin and Jason were cornerbacks in the Rutgers secondary from 2005-08. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and therefore was a year behind his brother in eligibility. McCourty is the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother Wasswa played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox.

### **ALL IN THE FAMILY: TE ROB GRONKOWSKI**

Rookie TE Rob Gronkowski grew up playing football against his brothers in the backyard. Now, he has a chance to play against them in the NFL. Dan Gronkowski, the oldest of the bunch, is currently in his second season as a TE for the Denver Broncos, while 23-year old Chris is currently a rookie with the Dallas Cowboys as a fullback. The Gronkowskis are among 22 different sets of brothers currently in the NFL, yet they are the only family that can claim to have three siblings in the league. According to the Pro Football Hall of Fame, the Gronkowski brothers join nine other familes to have at least three brothers playing at the same time.

### LIKE FATHER LIKE SON

WR Matthew Slater spent his college days at UCLA. The thirdyear promising young talent was born in 1985, when another Slater in The City of Angels was named to his second of seven Pro Bowls. Matthew's father, Jackie Slater, a Hall of Fame offensive tackle, spent his entire career with the Rams organization in LA. Matthew Slater, drafted in 2008, is one of six sons of Hall of Fame members to be drafted in NFL history.

## GREETINGS FROM KAARST, GERMANY: SEBASTIAN VOLLMER MAKES HIS MARK

A native of Kaarst, Germany, Vollmer did not begin playing football until the age of 14 when he started playing for the Dusseldorf club team. Vollmer helped lead his German prep school team to two national football championships. His early football success landed him an appearance in the 2004 Global Junior Championships in San Diego, which led him to a scholarship at Houston. He spoke almost no English when he signed with Houston, but he became fluent in the language as he developed from a 250-pound tight end into a 315-pound lineman who started his final 25 games at tackle for the Cougars. Vollmer's collegiate career created interest from the NFL where the Patriots drafted him in the second round of the 2009 draft. Earned the nickname, Seabass, during his playing days at Houston. The nickname has carried over to the NFL.

### **EDELMAN GOES FROM STANDOUT QB TO WR**

Julian Edelman began his college football career with a year at the College of San Mateo (Ca.) before transferring to Kent State where as a senior he completed 56% of his passes (153 of 275 passes for 1,820 yards) with 13 touchdowns. He was also the leading rusher, gaining 1,551 yards on 215 attempts (an average of 7.5 yards per carry) and scoring 13 touchdowns. His offensive numbers broke Kent State's single-season record for total offense set by Joshua Cribbs in 2003.

### PATRICK CHUNG'S JOURNEY TO THE NFL

Long before S Patrick Chung picked up flag football as a teen, his mother, Jamaican recording artist Sophia George, had preached about being a tough man in a song. Her hit single, 'Girlie Girlie" – a traditional reggae song about poking fun at a boy who was not man enough - topped the charts in 1985. Chung is aware that among his talents he was born with, speed and agility, singing is not one of them. Chung, who possesses a great sense of pride in his unique heritage - his mother is Jamaican and his father is half Jamaican and half Chinese, was born in Jamaica and moved to California at age 12 where he started to play football as a freshman in high school. Chung went on to star at Oregon, where he holds the distinction of starting more games than any other defensive player in school history with 51 starts. He original entered the draft as junior but ultimately decided to return for his senior season. Pinned to the back of his locker is a reminder of the support he has gotten to this stage, a Jamaican flag that indicates his family's importance to him

### **BENJARVUS GREEN-ELLIS – THE LAW FIRM**

BenJarvus Green-Ellis, who earned the nickname the Law Firm from his Patriots teammates because of his multi-part name. was signed by the Patriots as an undrafted free agent in 2008 out of the University of Mississippi. As a rookie, he recorded touchdowns in four straight games after being called up from the practice squad in October. His knack for finding the end zone has continued this season as he has reached the end zone a career-high 11 times, including his first two-touchdown performance vs. Minnesota (10/31). Green-Ellis also had a 112-yard rushing performance against the Vikings with 62 yards on the Patriots' final fourth quarter touchdown drive that extended a 3-point lead to a 10-point cushion in a 28-18 victory.

## PATRIOTS HAVE TOP TELEVISION RATINGS

The Patriots are on a record-setting pace for household ratings through 13 games in their designated market area with a 34.0 HH rating. This season, the Patriots have also been part of two record-setting NFL broadcasts. New England's 23-20 overtime victory over Baltimore on Sunday, Oct. 17 helped CBS set the mark for the highest rating for its single game window since it acquired the current AFC package in 2008. The Patriots-Jets game on Sunday, Sept. 19 was the most watched September CBS game ever.

## THE TEAM OF THE DECADE

hen Robert Kraft purchased the New England Patriots in 1994, few would have thought that just 16 years later the franchise would be the undisputed team of the decade in the first decade of the new millennium. Kraft brought a winning vision to the organization and dedicated his resources to building a consistent winner. On Jan. 27, 2000, Kraft hired Bill Belichick to coach the team, and three months later the team drafted then-unheralded quarterback Tom Brady, putting the final pieces in place for the Patriots to become the most successful NFL team of the 2000s.


