Partners in Patriotism Fund donates \$5K to FHS Class of 2015 for class gift in memory of Sam Berns

As the Foxborough High School Class of 2015 embarks on a new chapter, they will leave behind a lasting memory of their dear friend and classmate, Sam Berns, who passed away from progeria in January 2014.

Needing funds to build a memorial garden and walkway with benches and a plaque at the Sam Berns Community Field, this year's graduating class recently received a \$5,000 grant from the Partners in Patriotism Fund, which will assist in the cost of materials and labor needed to complete the class gift.

"We are very grateful of this donation," said Class of 2015 President Kayla Sepe. "A lot of people have stepped up to help us and the

Stadium upgrades to bring new business, more town revenue

It is an exciting time around Gillette Stadium and Patriot Place as many of our construction projects begin to take shape around the property.

At Gillette Stadium, the goal of the OPTUM Field Lounge, Cross Insurance Pavilion and Business Center, DraftKings Sports Zone and suite renovations is simple: enhance the guest experience for patrons and season ticket members who attend events at our venue.

The OPTUM Field Lounge, located in the south end zone, will be the first field-level

lounge at Gillette Stadium. On Patriots game days, the lounge will provide members with a new experience through its unique end zone views, outdoor terrace and climate-controlled indoor space. Eight hundred season ticket members

have purchased OPTUM Field Lounge memberships for the 2015 season.

On non-event days, the lounge will be used as function space available for rent to corporate and private parties. This includes anything from an outdoor reception to an indoor dinner or meeting.

On the north end of the stadium will be the **Cross Insurance Pavilion & Business Center.** This facility will further enhance the function space Gillette Stadium has to offer. especially on non-event days. Events expected to be held at the pavilion and business center include business meetings, trade shows, proms, dinners and cocktail receptions.

On event days, the facility will function as a higher end pre-game hospitality option for groups beginning 2.5 hours before the event. At 30 minutes prior to the event, the space will open to ticketed patrons inside the stadium

On the southwest corner of the stadium, near the UBid gate, will be **The DraftKings**

Sports Zone. This will be an enhanced concession stand geared towards fantasy football players inside the stadium on event day.

"For a 1 p.m. game, we will have every game on TV that's being played at that time," said Jim Nolan,

Patriots senior vice president of operations, finance and administration. "We will also have separate screens dedicated to fantasy stats, so people who are fantasy players, which there are a significant number, can come here and get their real-time fantasy information."

The DraftKings Sports Zone will be open to ticketed patrons and accessed on the main concourse.



Once completed, these projects are expected to generate new business through a variety of functions and events, especially on non-event days, which should result in additional meals tax and hotel occupancy tax revenue for the town.

"We are excited to bring these projects onboard because I think it gives all of our fans more reasons to continue to come to Gillette Stadium beyond the product on the field," Nolan said. "The more successful events we can bring to Gillette Stadium, the more revenue the town will realize."

At Patriot Place, construction will be starting soon on a new hotel in the North Marketplace adjacent to the Renaissance Boston Patriot Place Hotel. Expected to be completed in 2016, the new hotel will be a Hilton Garden Inn and feature 136 rooms.

To make room for the Hilton Garden Inn, Red Robin and Capriotti's Sandwich Shop have relocated elsewhere within the North Marketplace. Red Robin will be re-opening across from CBS Scene and 5 Wits later this summer and Capriotti's has opened its new location next to Five Guys Burgers and Fries.

Next to Capriotti's new location will be another new food option for Patriot Place guests, as Moe's Southwest Grill is expected to open this summer. Elsewhere, Olympia Sports is expected to complete its renovations and re-open later this summer.

Over at The Hall at Patriot Place presented by Raytheon, construction is underway on a new exhibit designed to highlight the New England Patriots' four Super Bowl championships and enhance the guest experience.

The exhibit, "The Super Bowl Experience," is expected to be completed this summer and will expand the current Super Bowl exhibit into what is currently The Fan Zone gallery.

The exhibit will feature areas dedicated to each Super Bowl championship season, a large projection screen that will show great content and Super Bowl stories from the players and an area that highlights one of the greatest defensive plays in Super Bowl history.

Additionally, The Hall will be making changes to its Hall of Fame displays. The pylons that currently display the names of the Hall of Famers will be replaced by high-resolution LED displays.

Speaking of The Hall, the Patriots will celebrate its 2015 Hall of Fame inductees, Willie McGinest and Houston Antwine, at a free ceremony open to the public on NRG Plaza on Wednesday, Aug. 5, at 5 p.m. Following the induction ceremony, the Patriots will hold its annual in-stadium practice open to season ticket members and Foxborough residents. We look forward to seeing you all at this event as the team prepares to defend its Super Bowl title!

In the community, we enjoyed a very active second quarter and saw many of our players out at Foxborough events, including Rob Gronkowski's impromptu tour through the Foxborough Public Schools with our fourth Lombardi Trophy! More on the Tour de Gronk can be found on Page 4.

Tour de Gronk kicked off at Foxborough High School, where the Patriots star surprised the senior class as they were rehearsing for graduation. Gronkowski shared advice about the value of hard work and following dreams



and the Partners in Patriotism Fund's generosity will help us do so much with the landscaping and maintenance needed for the garden. I'm very grateful for their support."

Foxborough High School senior Brian DeVellis, who spearheaded the class gift with Sepe, class adviser Kristen D'Errico and class officers, Meggie Maguire (vice president), Lauren Sampson (secretary) and Timothy O'Toole (treasurer), said these funds will help the class enhance the project.

"Almost half of the money we raised came from the Partners in Patriotism Fund, so we can use the funds to build the garden, benches and maybe add a flag pole and bird bath," DeVellis said. "We can make this project go from good to great."

After learning of the project, members of the Fund's Grants Committee were thrilled to support the Class of 2015's efforts.

the project will help tell visitors what Berns meant to Foxborough.

"The main goal is when people walk into the entrance of the field, they get a sense of Sam and who he was," said Sepe. "I think having a plaque and a garden at the field named after him, and adjacent to the school where he left his legacy, this is a nice way to do that."

For DeVellis, the project establishes a lasting legacy of Berns with meaningful input from his classmates and friends on how it should be done.

"Sam was a member of our class and we all grew up with him for so many years," DeVellis said. "But 10 years from now, 20 years from now, people might see the name on the scoreboard, but we were the ones that really knew him and have a true understanding of who he was and what he stood for. We thought this gift was perfect for our class to give to this community."

In addition to this grant, the Partners in Patriotism Fund, established by the Kraft family in 2014, has awarded more than \$40,000 in grants to a variety of Foxborough-based organizations and community initiatives. The Fund's Grants Committee, comprised of Foxborough residents, meets on a monthly basis at Gillette Stadium to review and vote on grant applications it has received.
