SUMMER SENSATION

Summer events at Gillette Stadium expected to net Foxborough nearly \$1 million in revenue

Summertime and the business is booming.

Gillette Stadium is regularly one of the world's busiest venues with the largest concert tours, marquee international soccer matches and other exciting events stopping in Foxborough each summer.

Billboard magazine ranked Gillette Stadium

among the top 10 venues in the world over the last decade. In 2012, the stadium ranked 15th in Pollstar's Top 100 worldwide ticket sales for outdoor stadium and festival sites.

So what does all this mean for Foxborough?

A whole lot of revenue.

Families enjoyed New England's first ever Monster Jam event at Gillette Stadium on June 21.

To date, we have been fortunate to host country music legend George Strait with special guests Tim McGraw and Faith Hill, an international soccer friendly between Mexico and Portugal, New England's first ever Monster Jam truck show and JAY Z and Beyonce's record-setting ON THE RUN Tour.

We are proud to report these events have earned Foxborough nearly \$500,000 in revenue and we still have more great events scheduled in August! One Direction will be in town for three nights (Aug. 7-9) and Luke Bryan will take the stage on Aug. 10 with guests Dierks Bentley, Lee Brice and Cole Swindell.

While we know these events can be a burden on the community and its infrastructure, we be-

lieve our plan to address traffic along Route 1 (more on page 5) and the revenue generated from these events will help compensate for the inconvenience. By summer's end, we anticipate the town's revenue from these eight events to reach nearly \$1 million (**Note**: This does not include revenue from Revolution matches, Patriots games and UMass football games).

As we begin the third quarter, we get back to football with the Patriots returning to the field for training camp, beginning on July 24. There is a lot about this team to be excited about and we can't wait to kick off the 2014 season.

The community is invited to watch the team practice inside Gillette Stadium on Friday, Aug. 1. Earlier that day Ty Law will be inducted into the Patriots Hall of Fame (details on both events can be found on page 6).

We will welcome UMass football back for a third season at Gillette Stadium as they kick off the 2014 campaign against Boston College on Aug. 30.

At Patriot Place, we welcomed nearly 7,000 runners to the fifth annual Harvard Pilgrim Finish at the 50, celebrated the opening of CVS/pharmacy and the five-year anniversary of the Brigham and Women's/Mass General Health Care Center.

We thank you all for your continued support and look forward to a great third quarter!



2014 NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS IN-STADIUM PRACTICE

A NIGHT OF FREE FOOTBALL

Foxborough residents are invited to watch the New England Patriots practice inside Gillette Stadium on Friday, Aug. 1, at 7 p.m.

Foxborough residents are invited to a free night of football under the lights of Gillette Stadium on Friday, Aug. 1, as the New England Patriots thank the town for their continued support by holding a special in-stadium practice closed to the general public.

Now in its eighth year, the annual event provides the Patriots organization a unique way to show appreciation to its community and loyal fan base.

"We started the tradition as an added amenity to thank our season ticket members for their dedication to the team and, as we do as often as we can, we included Foxborough residents to thank them for their support as well," said Dan Murphy, Gillette Stadium's vice president of external affairs.

Further enhancing the fan experience, the event includes detailed explanations of drills over the PA system, giving observers an understanding of why the players practice certain things and how it translates into an actual game.

"For residents who already like to attend training camp practices, this is a great opportunity to learn more about what they are watching," Murphy said.

The free event, which begins at 7 p.m., requires a complimentary ticket for entry and is exclusively for Patriots' season ticket members and Foxborough residents.

Season ticket members can find their complimentary instadium practice ticket in their season ticket booklets while Foxborough residents can now pick up tickets at one of the following locations:

- Public Safety Building
- Senior Center
- Boyden Library

Proof of residency is required to obtain complimentary tickets. Please note tickets <u>will not</u> be available at the Gillette Stadium ticket office.

Gates open at 5 p.m. and seating is general admission. Parking is free and stadium concessions will be open during practice.

Prior to the in-stadium practice, fans are invited to attend the 2014 Patriots Hall of Fame induction ceremony for former cornerback and three-time Super Bowl Champion Ty Law on the NRG Plaza outside The Hall at Patriot Place presented by Raytheon. The induction ceremony, which begins at 4:30 p.m.,

2014 NEW ENGLAND FITNESS CHALLENGE

FITNESS FUELING THEIR FUTURE

Gillette Stadium and Metro SWAT Officers Association team up to host fitness challenge on Sept. 27-28 to benefit local nonprofits

Building on the success of last year's 26-hour workout marathon, which raised more than \$135,000 for survivors of the Boston Marathon bombings, Gillette Stadium and the Metropolitan SWAT Officers Association (MSOA) are teaming up again to host an overnight fitness and endurance challenge with a focus on raising funds for local nonprofits.

"This year, we decided to organize a fitness challenge that would be open to the public with the proceeds being donated to worthy causes throughout New England," said Chris Baker of the Franklin Police Department. "The generosity of the Kraft family really makes this event happen. For them to do this really speaks to everything they do within the community."

The 2014 New England Fitness Challenge will be held in and around Gillette Stadium beginning at 10 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 27, and ending at 10 a.m. on Sunday, Sept. 28.

Each team, consisting of 10-15 members, is required to raise a minimum of \$5,000 to participate in the fitness challenge. Monies raised by participants will benefit four local nonprofits, the Special Olympics, Jack Williams' Wednesday's Child, the

New England Patriots Charitable Foun-

dation and the Boston Firefighters' Fund in honor of fallen heroes Ed Walsh and Michael Kennedy.

The event will consist of 12 obstacle challenges during the 12-hour event. The 12-station obstacles have been created by Metro SWAT officers and will include stadium stair runs, a Tresca Brothers cement truck pull, a Manic Training log carry, a stretch(er) run up the stadium ramps and more.

"Basically we turn the stadium into a giant amusement park with 12 endurance and fitness events in 12 hours," said Baker.

Foxborough resident and COO of TeamOps, Mark Briggs, who helped organize last year's 26-hour workout marathon and is working closely with MSOA to plan this year's challenge, said the best part of the event is the team component.

"It's a team challenge," said Briggs. "You look at the other fitness challenges that are out there and while teams may register together, it's always about the individual finish. In this challenge, you aren't finishing without a team."

Prizes will be awarded to the overall top performing team in the competition as well as team prizes for the fastest times at each of the 12 obstacle stations.





There will also be a grand prize awarded to the top fundraising team.

The team that raises the most money (with a minimum of \$5,000

per team participant) will travel with the New England Patriots on the team charter when they shuttle off to Buffalo to play the Bills on Oct. 12. The package will include roundtrip airfare, overnight accommodations at the team hotel and tickets to the game.

The overall top performing team of the timed New England Fitness Challenge obstacles will be awarded a VIP experience at the Patriots regular



Other prizes will be awarded to the top performing team at each of the

12 course stations.

Immediately following the New England Fitness Challenge, participants and their families will be invited to attend a post-event celebration at CBS Scene Restaurant and Bar at Patriot Place.

GILLETTE STADIUM EMPLOYEE PARKING PLAN

Proposed Plan Aims to Improve Rte. 1 Traffic

It's no secret that navigating Route 1 traffic, especially at the end of major stadium events, can be a slow and arduous task.

As a result, The Kraft Group recently took a significant step in its ongoing effort to improve the Route 1 traffic flow when the company presented plans to the planning board on July 10 to build a private road off Pierce Street (Route 140) to Patriot Place, connecting two private parking lots for nearly 1,200 stadium event employees.

"We are actively seeking ways to improve event day traffic flow along the Route 1 corridor," said Dan Krantz, Kraft Group vice president of construction and development. "The intent of this project is to remove nearly 1,200 employees from the Route 1 traffic mix."

Krantz said while this project is not the end all, be all to solve

the Route 1 traffic issue, it is part of an iterative process to improve traffic and better the guest experience.

"We hope that by taking several steps to improve traffic, our patrons will notice the efforts and notice the traffic congestion is lessened over the next one to three years," Krantz said.

The plan calls for one 550-ve-

hicle parking lot to be built at 119 Washington St. on the west side of Route 1 and a 630-vehicle parking lot be built toward the back of the former Motorcycles of Manchester site. Both lots would be used by stadium employees only.

The private, gated road would be paved and run roughly a halfmile from Pierce Street (Route 140) to the back of Bass Pro Shops, where an existing path continues to the stadium. Employees would take a shuttle bus from the parking lots to the Dana-Farber Field House to go to work during stadium events. There will be no tailgating permitted in these proposed lots.

"The idea is to get these employees out of the mix from Bass Pro Shops to our P1 entrance along Route 1," Krantz said. "That's where all the congestion occurs. Since these employees are not general patrons, we can better control where they park, how they will depart and where they will depart from. That's part of our traffic management plan that we will be presenting to the planning board."

This effort is not about generating more parking spaces as the stadium currently does not fill its parking lots to capacity. This plan is about improving traffic flow on Route 1.

Important Information for August Concerts at Gillette Stadium

Gillette Stadium officials would like to remind Foxborough residents of the upcoming One Direction and Luke Bryan concerts scheduled for the beginning of August.

Due to event traffic overlapping with evening commute traffic on Thursday, Aug. 7, and Friday, Aug. 8, Gillette Stadium is asking residents to be aware of heavy traffic on Route 1 between 95 and 495 early evening on Thursday and Friday for One Direction's "Where We Are Tour."

Additionally, residents are asked to be aware of stadium event traffic on Route 1 between 95 and 495 for One Direction's third show on Saturday, Aug. 9, and Luke Bryan's "That's My Kind of Night Tour" on Sunday, Aug. 10. The three One Direction shows begin at 7 p.m. and Sunday's Luke Bryan show begins at 6 p.m.



'A Great Day for Foxborough'

Robert Kraft and the New England Patriots Charitable Foundation surprise Igo Elementary School with \$60K grant for playground; FHS Choir with donation for new audio equipment

The NFL's first PLAY 60 and PLAY 60+ intergenerational event was full of surprises for dozens

of Foxborough senior citizens and elementary school students as New England Patriots Chairman and CEO Robert Kraft and the New England Patriots


