2016 Concert Series marks the busiest concert season in Gillette Stadium history

Since opening in 2002, Gillette Stadium has become one of the world's top grossing concert venues, according to Billboard magazine, annually bringing the most iconic performers to Foxborough.

While the stadium stage has been the scene of many monumental moments in music over the years, 2016 will mark a major milestone when the stadium hosts its busiest concert season ever with nine shows scheduled. This year's Stadium Concert Series kicked off on June 3 with Beyonce's The Formation World Tour, attracting a sellout crowd of more than 50,000 fans.

July brought five shows to the stadium with Luke Bryan's Kill The Lights Tour (July 15-16), Guns N' Roses' Not In This Lifetime Tour (July 19-20) and Coldplay's A Head Full of Dreams Tour (July 30).

August brings the return of Kenny Chesney, who has performed at Gillette Stadium more than any other artist, for two nights of his Spread The Love Tour (Aug. 26-27). The concert season wraps up in September with Bruce Springsteen & The E Street Band's The River Tour (Sept. 14).

The nine concerts are expected to attract more than 400,000 fans to Gillette Stadium, which will bring record revenues of more than \$1 million to the Town generated through ticket user fees and an additional hundreds of thousands of dollars through meals and hotel occupancy taxes.

nity was on full display this spring with examples of pride and partnership through events like Clean Up Foxboro Day, Founders Day and the flagpole dedication.

Events like these remind us of the civic pride and selfless volunteers that make Foxborough special. We were thrilled to join

so many of you in these initiatives and celebrations, as we look forward to these events every year.

Community partnership was also at the forefront of the second quarter, with some excellent news coming from Town Hall regarding the financial state of the town. The stadium's

event season for Fiscal Year 2016 (July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2016) generated the most Payments In Lieu of Taxes (P.I.L.O.T.) revenue in town history, generating a record \$3.8 million in ticket revenue for the town; up 34 percent, or nearly \$1 million, from the previous town record of \$2.8 million in Fiscal Year 2014.

"This is great news for the town and for Gillette Stadium and is reflective of the successful events that are being held at the venue," said Town Manager Bill Keegan.

Additionally, the town's finance department announced the town has achieved a "AAA" bond rating through the success of its businesses, support of its residents and financial management of its leaders. The AAA bond rating means Foxborough now has the highest credit quality rating available and is a notch higher than the U.S. government (rated at "AA+"). Keegan, during a recent Board of Selectmen meeting, thanked those who have

contributed to the historic rating

"We have to thank all of the people that contribute to [the town's financial strengths], including the commercial and residential taxpayers that pay into this community," Keegan said. "We are fortunate that we have large taxpayers like the Kraft Group, Schneider Electric, Chestnut Green and

> the new development at Forbes Crossing. ... Without those contributions to our tax base we wouldn't be getting a AAA rating right now."

We are very proud to contribute to Foxborough's strong economy and look forward to building on that success through stadium events in Fis-

cal Year 2017, including a record number of concerts at Gillette Stadium, and new developments at Patriot Place like the Hilton Garden Inn and Scorpion Bar A Mexican Cantina (both expected to open this fall). We also recently announced, in partnership with Harvard University, that the 2017 and 2018 NCAA Men's Lacrosse Championships will be played over Memorial Day Weekend at Gillette Stadium. This will be the fourth and fifth times the stadium has hosted the event and first time since 2012. These championships have been successful in the past, generating \$310,037 in town ticket revenue in 2008, \$260,405 in 2009 and \$215,059 in 2012.

In June, we hosted Beyonce's The Formation World Tour, three Copa America soccer matches, including the world's top team, Argentina, and the world's top player, Lionel Messi, and the Monster Jam truck series. Looking ahead to the third quarter, we are excited to host eight concerts and welcome the return of Patriots and UMass football.

The Patriots opened their 57th annual training camp - and 14th straight camp at Gillette Stadium - on July 27 with the first public practice held on July 28 on the fields behind Gillette Stadium.

The daily practice sessions are free and open to the public. As dates and times for training camp are confirmed, they will be updated on the Patriots website, www.Patriots.com/training camp.

For the 10th consecutive season, the Patriots invited Foxborough residents and season ticket members to the popular in-stadium practice on Aug. 1 as part of a free evening of football for fans that kicked off earlier in the evening with the Patriots Hall of Fame induction ceremony for former running back and three-time Super Bowl champion, Kevin Faulk.

The in-stadium practice included detailed explanations of drills over the stadium's PA system and gave fans an opportunity to watch players go through numerous individual drills before participating in 7-on-7 and 11-on-11 drills.

After a quick Q&A session in the cafeteria, Butler headed off to gym class to see how Warriors train.

Butler helped FHS wellness teacher C.J. Neely lead warm ups with laps around the gymnasium and lunges, high kicks and shuffles across the floor.

Once the class was warmed up, Butler took a break from testing their physical abilities and

In a testament to Foxborough's community spirit, a group of volunteers led by Jack Authelet, Jim DeVellis, Tina Belanger and Rachel Calabrese set out to replace the 100-year-old flagpole on the Common. After receiving more than 120 donations from the community, including a \$12,000 donation from the Partners in Patriotism Fund, the Town constructed a fiberglass pole that stands more than 100 feet tall.



"This is such a great

representation of who we are and what we are as a community," said Authelet. "We have the thrill of being responsible for getting this flagpole up and getting that flag to fly. Long may it wave and long may we stand proud."

The dedication concluded with the crowd, including members of the PIP Fund's Grants Committee (pictured above), collectively cutting the ribbon to the new flagpole.


