TE	1	Brandon Pettigrew	Oklahoma State	6-5	263	4.85
<b>Notes:</b> [Andy Hart] Decent hands, but not quick or fast. All around tight end in college. [Erik Scalavino] Style of play reminiscent of Ben Coates. [Paul Perillo] Great size but not overly fast or quick; Decent hands; Not a lot to watch on tape.						
TE	2	Chase Coffman	Missouri	6-6	244	4.83
<b>Notes:</b> [Andy Hart] Ultra productive. Very good hands. Decent athlete but speed/quickness questions. [Erik Scalavino] A bit of a plodder, but has great hands. Questions about his blocking ability. [Paul Perillo] Great hands; Pretty athletic despite average speed; Great weapon as pass catcher.						
TE	3	Jared Cook*	South Carolina	6-5	246	4.45
<b>Notes:</b> [Andy Hart] Freak athletically. Adjusts to ball and uses hands well. Not as productive as expected. Pure mismatch. [Erik Scalavino] Very fast for a big guy. Questionable blocking ability, however. [Paul Perillo] Stretches field with athleticism; Smooth runner with soft hands; Makes plays.						
TE	3	James Casey*	Rice	6-3	246	4.71
<b>Notes:</b> [Andy Hart] Does it all. Good possession guy, fights in traffic. Mature. Good athlete. [Erik Scalavino] Amazing, versatile athlete. The best at this position. Similar to Tim Tebow when running the Wildcat. [Paul Perillo] Versatile with good hands; Not much of a runner, more of a bull; Overachiever.						
TE	4	Cornelius Ingram	Florida	6-4	245	4.63
<b>Notes:</b> [Andy Hart] Decent hands. Lean build. Good athlete. Playmaker coming off ACL injury. [Erik Scalavino] Thin-looking frame, but very strong and athletic. [Paul Perillo] Great athlete with good body control; Plays well in space; Coming off serious knee injury.						
TE	5	Shawn Nelson	Southern Miss	6-5	240	4.56
<b>Notes:</b> [Andy Hart] WR-like pass catcher. Goes and gets the ball. Athletic. Toughness? [Erik Scalavino] On the lighter side for a tight end. Adequate game film, but nothing impressive stands out. [Paul Perillo] Deep threat with big-play ability; Very athletic for position; Small frame could make blocking a problem.

<b>Notes:</b> [Andy Hart] Does it all. Good possession guy, fights in traffic. Mature. Good athlete. [Erik Scalavino] Amazing, versatile athlete. The best at this position. Similar to Tim Tebow when running the Wildcat. [Paul Perillo] Versatile with good hands; Not much of a runner, more of a bull; Overachiever.

<b>Notes:</b> [Andy Hart] Body catches at times. Decent athlete. Very productive. Small build. [Erik Scalavino] Looks more like a wide receiver. May need to switch to that position at the next level. [Paul Perillo] Small but great hands; Makes tough catches in traffic; Productive but lacks size for TE.						
TE		Bear Pascoe	Fresno State	6-5	251	4.97
<b>Notes:</b> [Andy Hart] Traditional TE. Blocker. Plays tough. Not a playmaker but goes after ball well. Powerful runner. [Erik Scalavino] Excellent combination of size and athleticism. Very hard to bring down after the catch. [Paul Perillo] Great size; Lacks speed but finds openings; Solid late prospect.

[Andy Hart] Slow. Old school. Lot of production with Matt Ryan. Not great athlete. Solid hands. Good in traffic. [Erik Scalavino] Insert comments. [Paul Perillo] Good hands but lacks speed and athleticism; Made the routine look difficult.

<b>Heart condition detected at Scouting Combine, effectively ending his pursuit of NFL.</b>

<b>Notes:</b> [Andy Hart] All-around TE from pro system. Big target. Decent athlete. [Erik Scalavino] Perfect size for the position. Has the ability to get open downfield in the passing game. [Paul Perillo] Great size; Good hands and body control; Runs good routes; Not fast but showed athleticism.

<b>Notes:</b> [Andy Hart] True TE. Blocker. Not overly fast or quick. Catches well with hands and fights for ball in traffic. [Erik Scalavino] Lumbering big body. Unimpressive game film. [Paul Perillo] Good, strong hands to make catches in traffic; Lacks speed; Not a big-play threat.

<b>Notes:</b> [Andy Hart] Solid. Goes and gets the ball. Good athlete. Decent game speed. Good RZ target. Former QB. [Erik Scalavino] Speedy for his size. Very athletic former QB at ECU. [Paul Perillo] Good athlete with soft hands; Catches ball away from his body; Solid late prospect with potential.
